# Identified priorities for ICANN (1/2)

- Complete the MoU Process with the US DOC
- Proactively ensure the future stability and security of root server system
- Substantially augment core IANA services and ensure they function effectively
- Efficiently introduce new gTLDs to increase competition in the domain name space
- Significantly expand available resources to assist developing nation Internet communities with education and technical coordination
- Meaningfully increase preparation of ICANN materials in multi-lingual formats

# Identified priorities for ICANN (2/2)

- Actively promote consumer interests through information and service
- Effectively educate consumers on how to obtain resources for dispute resolution, consumer protection and law enforcement
- Considerably strengthen services to gTLD Registries to address their growing needs as new gTLDs are introduced
- Significantly strengthen services to gTLD Registrars to ensure a healthy, competitive marketplace
- Materially aid gTLD Registrars with managing consumer complaints

# At-Large Organizing

- Implemented application approval process (first round of votes in December 2003, second round of votes in February 2004, All applications except one approved)
- 8 more applications received since Tunis, currently 10 accredited organizations under due diligence

# .eu

- The European Commission chose EURid ([www.eurid.org](http://www.eurid.org)) to manage .eu domain names on May 2003
- The non-profit organisation EURid asbl/vzw was incorporated under Belgian law on 8 April 2003 and has its registered office in Brussels
- Public Policy Rules for .eu by the European Commission, 30 Apr 2004
- Sunrise period (phased registration) begins Dec 2004 (approx.)
- ISOC-ECC (Internet Society European Chapters Coordinating Council [www.isoc-ecc.org](http://www.isoc-ecc.org)) is an Associate member of EURid representing the European Internet users Community
